

Part 1: Personal Questions (about **2'** minutes each candidate)

Prepare a small talk about yourself

- Name
- Age
- Class
- Family
- Hobbies
- Future Plans

** Listen carefully to your partner. Be prepared to ask him/her questions on things that he/she says*

Part 2: Project (about **6'** minutes each candidate)

Show your project to the examiner and present it

- Describe your project: Give all relevant information - what it is, how it is done, some interesting facts about it.
- Show some of your pictures and say what is important about them
- Explain why you find it important

The examiner may ask you:

- Is it popular in Greece?
- Is it popular with both boys and girls?
- What is the most difficult thing about it?
- Is it dangerous?
- Where can you play it or practice it?
- How is it different from other sports / hobbies?
- How many years do you have to practice to become professional?
- Preparing your project did you find out something you didn't know?

The examiner will ask your partner to comment on what you've said

- Would you like to do this..(sport)?
- Have you ever tried this... (sport)?

** Listen carefully to your partner. Be prepared to ask him/her questions on things that he/she says*

TIE: Interview Questions

Part 3: News Item (about 6' minutes each candidate)

Show your news item to the examiner and present it

- Make a short presentation of your news item
- Say what it is about
- Name your sources and explain how the each source presents the item
(useful language: *the first article says that...*,
the journalist of the second report claims that...,
- Show your photos and explain their importance

The examiner may ask you:

- What does the journalist think about..?
- What's your personal opinion on the matter?
- What do you think it is going to happen next?
- How did you decide to write about this story/item?

The examiner will ask your partner to comment on what you've said

- What do you think?
- Is it true or not?

** Listen carefully to your partner. Be prepared to ask him/her questions on things that he/she says*

or Part 3: Book (about 6' minutes each candidate)

Present your book

- Narrate the plot
- Talk about the main characters
- Say if and why you liked it

The examiner may ask you:

- Could you predict the ending of the book?
- Would you recommend this book to your friends?
- Would you change anything in the story?

The examiner will ask your partner :

- Have you read this book?
- If yes, what did you like about it?
- If not, would you like to read it?
