1. Opinion Essay

Introduction	Restate the topic as a general issue that needs to be addressed. State your opinion.
Main Body [Version I: only your opinion]	§1. 1 st aspect of the issue. Start with a clear topic sentence. Use appropriate linkers. §2. 2 nd aspect of the issue. Start with a clear topic sentence. Use appropriate linkers.
Main Body [Version II: mention the opposing view]	§1. Your opinion. Start with a clear topic sentence. Use appropriate linkers. §2. The opposing view. Analyse the opposing view and explain why it is wrong .
Conclusion	Summarise your view. Leave the readers with a thought provoking idea.

2. For & Against Essay

Introduction	Restate the topic as a general issue that needs to be addressed. (Do not state your opinion here)
Main Body	<p>§1. Negative aspects of the issue. Start with a clear topic sentence. Use appropriate linkers</p> <p>§2. Positive aspects of the issue. Start with a clear topic sentence. Use appropriate linkers</p>
Conclusion	Repeat the two aspects and express your opinion. <i>Considering all the above, it is clear that... outweigh the...</i>

3. Cause and/or Effect Essay

Read the title carefully and see whether you need to analyse the causes or the effects or both.

Introduction	Restate the topic as a general issue that needs to be examined. Mention whether you will focus on causes, effects or both
Main Body	<p>§1. 1st cause/effect. State in the topic sentence whether you will focus on a cause or an effect. If it is a cause talk about the deeper roots behind this reason. If it is an effect show the further implications of this phenomenon</p> <p>§2. repeat the same pattern.</p> <p>§3. (If it is required) repeat the same pattern</p>
Conclusion	Summarise what you have said. Leave the readers with a thought provoking idea.

4. Problem Solving Essay

Introduction	Restate the topic as a general issue that needs to be addressed. Mention the problem and tell that solutions do exist.
Main Body [Version I]	<p>§1. Analyse the problem: Aspects of the problem and negative consequences.</p> <p>§2,3. Provide the solutions. Break it into 2 or 3 paragraphs. Each paragraph is devoted to one solution. Show how things will be better if you put this solution into practice.</p>
Main Body [Version II]	<p>§1. 1st aspect of the problem and its negative consequences. Possible solutions and its positive results.</p> <p>§2. 2nd aspect of the problem and its negative consequences. Possible solutions and its positive results.</p> <p>§3. repeat the same pattern if it is required.</p>
Conclusion	Express the confidence that if the solutions are implemented the problem will be solved.

5. Narrative Essay

Introduction	Restate the topic as a general issue that needs to be addressed.
Main Body	<p>§1. Approach the topic as a general issue.</p> <p>§2,3. Narrate your personal example. Break it into 2 or 3 paragraphs. Before the main event – After the main event.</p>
Conclusion	Discuss the general influence of this specific event.

*. “Unique” Essay: tasks that not quite fit any mold

Read the title carefully and **number** the points that it raises.

Introduction	Restate the topic as a general issue that needs to be addressed.
Main Body	<p>§1. 1st point of the issue. Start with a clear topic sentence. Use appropriate linkers.</p> <p>§2. 2nd point of the issue. Start with a clear topic sentence. Use appropriate linkers.</p> <p>§3. repeat the same pattern if it is required</p>
Conclusion	Summarise what you have said. Leave the readers with a thought provoking idea.

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
